The skills and knowledge contained in this material can be adapted for any health care or residential setting.
<b>Program Objectives</b>	At the completion of the program, participants will be able to: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Identify the work setting and job responsibilities of the nursing assistant. Concepts include communication, safety precautions, and emergency care.</li><li>2. Apply skills and principles used in the role of the nursing assistant to aid patients to meet their basic physical and safety needs.</li><li>3. Explore the nursing assistant's role in meeting love and belonging, self-esteem, and self-actualization needs of the patient.</li></ol>
